a synopsis of **PSALM 119**

The Apostle Paul held the Word of God in highest esteem: inspired, able to correct and enliven us, the sword of the Spirit (2 Timothy 3:16, 17; Ephesians 6:17). Hebrews 4:12 says it's the sharpest and most powerful of all two-edged swords. The unknown writer of Psalm 119 exalts it as a treasure and light that will make us solid in the midst of an ungodly world in trouble. This longest chapter in the Bible is unusual in style: made up of 22 stanzas, each with eight verses. Each stanza stands alone. When together, the 119th Psalm becomes a great anthem of praise for God's Word. Psalm 119 might be summarized like this:

- 1. **1-8.** The Bible reveals the graciousness of God, and creates the desire and joy of walking in God's good paths
- 2. **9-16.** Internalizing the Word of God serves as a fortress in our personal war with sin
- 3. 17-24. The truths of God's Word provide counsel to face the attacks that come our way
- 4. **25-32.** God's Word keeps us honest with ourselves and encourages us in our daily walk with the Lord
- 5. **33-40.** Eagerness to understand God's Word creates an atmosphere of true life that "things" cannot give
- 6. **41-48.** Delight and trust in the Bible gives hope, freedom, and confidence for living
- 7. **49-56.** The promises of Scripture comfort us in the troubles stirred up by arrogant mockers of our faith
- 8. **57-64.** Those who are firmly anchored in the Word and create fellowship with others like them find strength to resist the drag of sin that is always in front of us
- 9. **65-72.** Hard times bring God's discipline, but can also drive us back to the Word where we find His tenderness and fellowship that is worth more than gold and silver
- 10. **73-80.** Following God's Word—not just knowing it—brings joy not only to our own lives but also to others who love God
- 11. **81-88.** A refusal to abandon the Scriptures in times of trouble bring the refreshment of God's love and comfort
- 12. **89-96.** The eternal Word of God stands firm in the heavens, a solid Rock on which to build life
- 13. 97-104. Meditating on the Word of God provides wisdom and insight to the true way of life
- 14. **105-112.** Scripture is a treasure—a light guiding us away from the darkness that destroys us
- 15. **113-120.** Scripture warns us against divided loyalties. God and God alone is the only refuge and shield that can be trusted
- 121-128. Every commandment of God is right. As we keep our eyes focused on Him we will see the truth of His
 promises
- 17. 129-136. Love for the Word is a light making us victorious over the evil rulers of this world's darkness
- 18. **137-144.** We can believe the Scripture is trustworthy and right for every situation because Scripture is the Word of God—the voice of Him who is Truth and Righteousness
- 19. **145-152.** The more we meditate on the Word—day and night—the greater the likelihood of victory in our struggle
- 20. **153-160.** Confidence in the truth of Scripture is a powerful tool when we find ourselves in the midst of adversity
- 21. 161-168. Love for the Word of God brings peace and steadiness as we walk through the valley of deep darkness
- 22. **169-176.** Remembering the truth of the Word is worth everything when we are tripped up by our sin and shortcomings

Pearl of Great Price in this psalm: "I have wondered away like a lost sheep; <u>come and find me</u>, for I have not forgotten your commands (119: 176 NLT). Now that's good news, good news indeed!

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
